
The US Constitution is the supreme law of our country. It defines how our government is formed and your rights within it. There is no other document we will study that more directly affects your life and future.

The Articles of Confederation

- The first attempt at a ruling document for states
- Very limited powers for the central government- most powers remain with the states.
- Didn't even call it a government
 - called it a "firm league of friendship."
- So weak that Virginia's state navy was larger than the one for the whole country.






The Constitutional Congress

- Met in secrecy and had to swear not to talk about what happened inside.
- They ultimately decided the Articles needed to be abandoned and started over with a new document.

Compromises





- The Great Compromise split congress with half divided by population (House of Representatives), half divided evenly (Senate).






- "We the People" the government is powered by the people.
- The people express their power by voting for their political representatives.
- Decisions are made based on the will of the majority – not the will of one ruler.



<u>Dual Sovereignty</u> - power is divided between the...

Federal Government – national government with power over those things that effect everyone

State governments – local govts with power over everything else








- No one branch should have enough power to control the other branches but...
- Each branch has a way to check (limit) the power of the other branches.








The Amendment Process
