

Example Introduction: Yesterday morning I woke up to see frost covering the grass on my lawn. My mind immediately went to the possibility of snow. Every year, I look forward to the first snowfall of the season for one reason: SNOW DAYS! Snow days are fun because you don't have to go to school, you can spend more time with your family, and you get to play in the snow.
